Opening Ceremonies Start 2012 CTUSBC Open Tournament

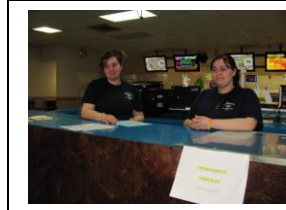

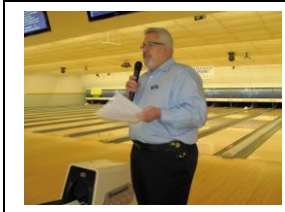

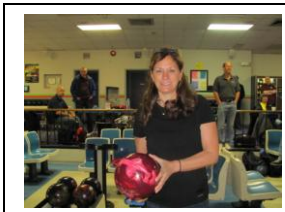

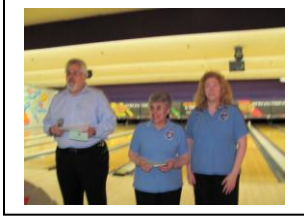

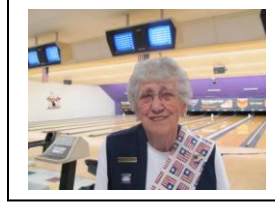

Youth Bowler Shoots First 300

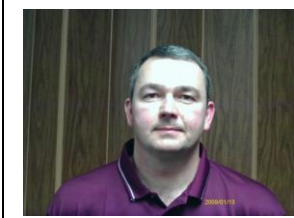
